Biography

Your bio should include a short introduction on the topics you're studying for your research, and where you're studying (institute/university). Also, we encourage you to write briefly about yourself as a person. Sharing about your hobbies, passion, interests will help our audience connect with you better. Make sure you limit the bio to 1900-2000 characters (Instagram limit).

Scope

Please include captions for all provided images, and a link to the image source if using Creative Commons.

We reserve the right to make minor edits to your article including grammar and syntax. We may also add links to other relevant articles in the text. For any larger changes, we will confirm with you prior to posting.
